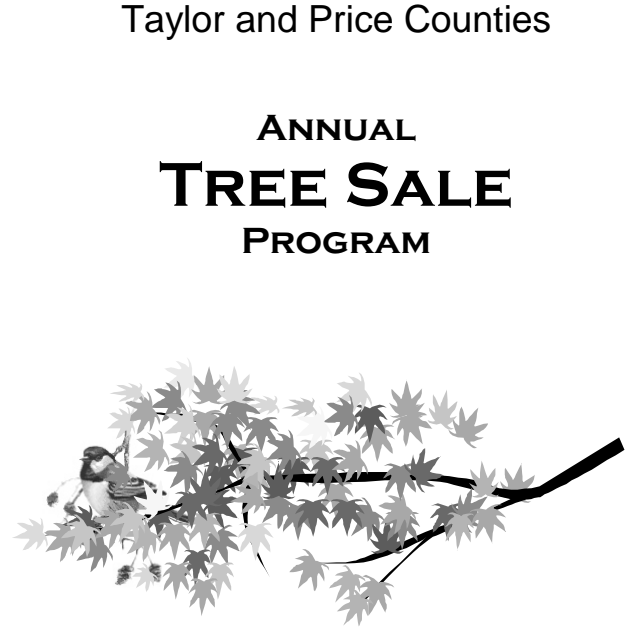
If a significant number of plants are not of specified size or adequate health, it will be your responsibility to make this known to the LCD before they are planted and within one week of pickup.
